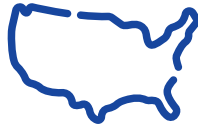

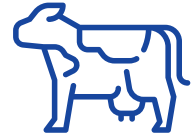
In U.S. Milk Production

Milk Produced Annually

Texas dairy delivers:

- **\$53.8 billion** total economic impact
- **258,000** total jobs
- **\$14.3 billion** in wages
- **3%** Texas GDP contribution
- **\$1.62 billion** paid in local and state taxes
- **\$2.8 billion** paid in federal taxes
- **\$724.3 million** in exports

Jobs and income are generated not only by milk production, but also when farmers purchase machinery, trucks, fuel and other equipment; buy feed and healthcare for their animals; and use services such as banking and insurance.

After the milk leaves the farm, it continues to create jobs in transportation, distribution, processing and retail.
